PRESENTATIONS

436. Governor General's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Exemplary Service Medal

Mr. John Prno, Director of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Waterloo Region/Chairman of the Governor General's Awards Committee on behalf of AMEMSO noted that the Governor General's EMS Exemplary Medal recognizes professionals in the provision of pre-hospital emergency medical services who performed their duties in an exemplary manner, characterized by good conduct, industry and efficiency. Awardees must have completed a minimum of twenty years of exemplary service with emergency medical services, of which ten were in the performance of duties involving potential risk.

Mr. Prno, Regional Chair Partington and Councillor Casselman awarded the Governor General's Emergency Medical Services Exemplary Service Medal to Edward Levere of Fort Erie who was unable to attend the awards reception in London on September 25th.

Regional Council extended their congratulations to Mr. Levere who performed over 35 years of exemplary service.

437. T. Roy Adams Humanitarian of the Year Award

In honour of the memory of the late Councillor T. Roy Adams, the Region initiated a memorial award in 2003 in his name to honour a resident of Niagara who best exemplifies Roy's values and dedication to community service; a person who sees volunteerism as an integral part of their life.

Councillor Rigby on behalf of this year's Adjudication Committee was pleased to announce that Jill and Gary Taylor are the T. Roy Adams Humanitarian of the Year Award recipients for 2008.

Jill Taylor was sponsored by Mary Gordon and Laura Dumas from the Ontario March of Dimes where she began volunteering 14 years ago. Over the years she has been involved in fundraising initiatives for the Peach Festival Committee; has been instrumental in soliciting donations for many other programs by scouring the Niagara Region for donations from local businesses, individuals and organizations. As well as being an active volunteer, she has solicited countless donations from the Annual Bowl-a-Rama and the Annual Golf Tournament. Jill has taken the lead in acquiring the necessities for the MOD Squad Dinner Socials whose aim is to include people with disabilities who may not otherwise have the opportunity to attend many social functions. She has also been a volunteer for 19 years with Tender Wishes Foundation.

Currently, Jill volunteers in the March of Dimes Recycled Rental Equipment Program which accepts donations of used mobility aids which are then made available for rent or purchase. Volunteering with this program made the next

progression easy. Almost 2 years ago Jill and her husband Gary started “For the Needy – Not the Greedy”. Their home has become the warehouse for donated mobility aids, hospital and medical equipment which she and her husband restore, clean and hand-deliver to people in need in the Northern Ontario area, free of charge.

Gary Taylor was sponsored by Ada Blair from the Tender Wishes Foundation who describes him as a man of great compassion, talent, courage, honor and integrity. He has been volunteering with this organization for 15 years in many areas including fundraising, parades, the Children’s Christmas Party, Pumpkinfest, golf tournaments, silent auctions, gala, BBQ’s and much more. As well, on behalf of the Niagara Amputee Association, Gary visits patients who have lost or about to lose limbs to offer his support, comfort, compassion and a wealth of knowledge. Gary’s own leg was amputated in 1993 but nothing stops him, and this is what the patients see - hope.

Gary has also volunteered with many other organizations in Niagara including several committees of the Ontario March of Dimes, the Peach Festival, Willoughby Fire Department, Chippawa Lions Cub, South Niagara Crisis Centre, Salvation Army with his wife Jill, Heart Niagara Bike Ride, Mayors Advisory Committee for Niagara Falls, Parks and Recreations Steering Committee Niagara Falls and Willoughby Recreations Committee. He has also helped raise money for services dogs in the area and collected furniture and clothing for victims burned out of their homes.

438. Excellence Awards

Barb Dupont, Co-Chair, Recognition of Excellence Sub-Committee, Corporate Employee Recognition Team (CERT) was pleased to announce the following winners of Excellence Awards:

A Customer Service Award was presented to Andrea Smith for her outstanding contribution to the promotion of substance abuse prevention. She has enabled others to act by providing up-to-date literature and priorities related to communicating the importance of substance abuse prevention to students in schools.

A Innovation Award was presented to Sandra Romagnoli for the outstanding contribution to increasing the awareness of clear language within her profession. Sandra led much of the work on provincial change regarding clear language through the RNAO website promoting health literacy.

Regional Stars are presented to employees to recognize individual “deeds” or accomplishments that do not fall within the criteria for the Recognition of Excellence Awards. “Regional Stars” recognize specific individual acts by Regional employees that go “above and beyond” their responsibilities with the Region. Regional Stars will be presented at an appropriate occasion in the workplace to the following employees:

Sharon Bucsis and Doris Raby are honoured with a Regional Stars for protecting the property of others, that being a member of the public who mislaid her purse prior to a meeting. They held it for her and asked her about it when she came out of the meeting. She quotes "What saviours they are – and incredibly thoughtful. I would have been lost without my keys, wallet, passport....they are truly wonderful folks and a real credit to public service."

Cindy Gage is honoured with a Regional Star for her outstanding contribution to coordinate staffing at the seniors home over a very busy weekend. She was able to schedule the nursing, dietary, housekeeping and RN staff so that the home was covered in all departments.

REGIONAL CHAIR'S REMARKS

439. Regional Chair Partington expressed appreciation for all of the candidates that put their name forward during the recent federal election and expressed his appreciation to John Maloney for his service to the residents of Niagara and wished him well in his future endeavours. He extended congratulations to Rob Nicholson, Rick Dykstra, Dean Allison and Niagara's newest MP, Malcom Allen.

The Chair apprised Council of his recent trip to German to promote Niagara as a very compelling and competitive location for future investment by companies wanting to expand their sales and market share in North America. The mission included Patrick Gedge, CEO, NEDC; Valerie Kuhns, Vice President, NEDC; Mayor Damian Goulbourne and Dan Degazio, Welland's Economic Development Officer. Meetings were held with federal embassy and consulate officials, trade commissioners and companies in northern and southern Germany. The focus was on building relationships with companies involved with green energy, especially wind power, who will be interested in making further investments into manufacturing in North America and strengthening relationships with German automotive industry that has investments in North America. On behalf of Niagara Falls and Mayor Salci a plaque was presented from the City of Niagara Falls to the head office of Edscha celebrating 21 years of successful operations in the Region.

Chair Partington provided comments on the economy and recognized and thanked the more than 200 residents of the Region, including business and community leaders who took part in the Niagara Economic Forum last April. Chair Partington acknowledged successes such as investments in world-class golf courses; new hotels being built; internationally known entertainers performing at Niagara Fallsview Casino Resort; the proposed motor sport, entertainment and commercial complex in Fort Erie; and wine making industry.

Chair Partington acknowledged the closing of the John Deere factory in Welland and the need to update Niagara's strategy to reflect the new economic realities and challenges.

In order to create and maintain a competitive business environment, the Chair recommended the following:

- Encourage emerging industries such as environmental and green technologies by providing incubator facilities and helping them find venture capital
- Encourage and support pure and applied research and innovation by working with companies in the private sector like Norgen and with Niagara College and Brock University
- Buying locally to help farmers, local businesses and industries
- Work more closely with Niagara College and Brock University in a wide variety of areas that are just being identified including the new bio-science centre.
- Provide infrastructure such as roads; sewers and water lines that industry needs to locate here.
- Implement a full range of Smart Growth and Brownfield initiatives

The Chair advised that Niagara could not do it alone and needed the help and active cooperation of all levels of government and presented some key areas where government could make a difference such as the Gateway Economic Zone and Centre; the implementation of the Niagara Region Transportation Strategy and government support to fund its key objectives; the reduction in Business Education Tax in Niagara; and the implementation of a Niagara Development Fund.

Chair Partington thanked Duane Van Alstine of Balfour Greenhouses of Fenwick for the plants adorning the Council Chamber. These plants will be donated to Deer Park Villa in Grimsby.

WHEREAS the Provincial MoveOntario 2020 Plan with a \$17.5 Billion budget does not explicitly include Niagara;

WHEREAS the proposed Metrolinx 25 Year \$50 Billion plan does not explicitly include Niagara;

WHEREAS GO Transit Rail Service connecting Niagara from Niagara Falls through the Greenbelt to the rest of the Golden Horseshoe would strengthen Niagara's growth potential;

WHEREAS GO Transit Rail Service to Niagara Falls would connect Ontario's largest tourist markets, Toronto and Niagara Falls;

WHEREAS growth of a strong Niagara wide transit plan is strengthened by a strong Niagara GO Transit Rail and GO Bus plan and vice versa; and

WHEREAS Niagara needs reliable public transportation between major population and job clusters and GO Transit Rail Service and GO Bus to Niagara Falls would do half the job, leaving municipal transit to connect the rest of the Niagara Region into a GO Transit Greater Niagara Circle Route.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Regional Municipality of Niagara requests the Province of Ontario to include Niagara in any plans for GO Transit infrastructure development; and

That Regional Chair Partington meet with Niagara MPP's and the Minister of Transportation to make the case for the need and benefits of good GO Transit Rail, GO Bus Service and **Marine Service** through Niagara's Greenbelt to Niagara Falls.

Councillor Henderson advised Council that the Township of Wainfleet has not been apprised of any proposed costs related to buried transmission lines.
451. Fort Erie Motor-Sport Project
Councillor Martin apprised Council of his recent trip to Dubai and his meetings with the investment consortium led by Kuwaiti Islamic investment bank Bayt Al Mal Investments. He attended with Jim Thibert, General Manager of Fort Erie's Economic Development and Tourism Corp. and Sandra Papatello, Ontario's Minister of Economic Development and Trade. Bayt Al Mal has options to purchase 623 acres of land six kilometres from the U.S.-Canadian border in Fort Erie where it plans to build the complex. It is anticipated that the project will generate more than \$34 million annually in new tax revenue and create more than 1,200 jobs. Councillor Martin advised he would keep Council apprised of the project as it develops.
