A lesson to last a lifetime...

Children love to play and explore outside around their home. They love to go for walks and see the world. If a child is walking, or even sitting in a stroller, it is never too early to teach them how to be safe when walking outside.

Every time you cross the street, tell your child how to cross safely. Each time you stop and look for traffic, say out loud, *“It is time to stop, look, and listen for moving cars. Are there moving cars over here? Are there moving cars over there? No moving cars, OK, it is safe to cross.”* **OR** *“There is a moving car. We need to wait until it is safe.”* Before you know it, they will stop, look, and listen for moving cars with you.

Enjoy the world outside with your child.

Stop, look, and listen together.

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
